- **3.** Committee members use the key questions listed below for monitoring adherence to the <a href="STMA">STMA</a> Strategic Roadmap.
  - Does the information presented correlate with the district's mission, vision, and core values?
  - Do any adjustments need to be made in order to more closely adhere to the district's mission, vision, core values, or strategic directions?
- **4.** John McDonald, Jeanette Aanerud, Corey Lahr, K-4 Principals, facilitated a discussion revolving around K-4 Personal & Social Development Grading. (see slides 7-8 of the <u>9.27.21 DAC Presentation</u>)

Parent input centered on the following themes:

- Is using letter grades in third and fourth grade age appropriate and does it foster a growth mindset and mindsets of learning in students? What data or evidence was used to support the decision to utilize letter grades in 3rd and 4th grade?
- Increase the use of formative feedback rather than letter grades on assignments.
- How can the teachers communicate more effectively and frequently regarding a student's personal and social development so parents can help nurture these skills?
- Concern: Parents receive feedback regarding personal and social development on the report card only if the student is experiencing issues in specific areas.
- **5.** Cassie Akerson, Supervisor of Curriculum & Student Programming, presented the district's **2020-2021 STMA's World's Best Workforce Plan** <u>Summary of Results/Goals</u>.

Under <u>Minnesota Statutes</u>, <u>section 120B.11</u>, school boards are mandated to adopt a long-term comprehensive strategic plan to support and improve teaching and learning. The district's **World's Best Workforce Plan** must address goals and professional development related to the following five areas:

- All students are ready for school
- All third-graders can read at grade level.
- All racial and economic achievement gaps between students are closed.
- All students are ready for career and college.

### Parent Input:

- How and when do students receive additional support after learning disruption?
- How will MTSS work at the elementary, middle, and high school levels?

**6.** Jonah Barten, Testing and Assessment Coordinator, presented the district's **2020-2021 STMA Assessment Results Report** 

### Parent Input:

- It is important that kids understand that FAST & MAP tests are adaptive so the questions get harder, but revert back to their achievement level after a few incorrect answers to questions. Some kids experience a type of perfection paralysis when they start to encounter questions beyond their achievement level.
- Is the non-state/federal required testing identifying students that teachers couldn't already identify? Is the time and money spent on non-required testing providing value, especially at the middle school level?
